


# **Acknowledgement of Native American Homelands**

Nature based Solutions ensure human well-being and benefit biodiversity by addressing societal challenges through sustainable actions that protect and restore living ecosystems and their functions.

# **UPDATE Working Standard + Criteria for NBS**

**Standard:** Nature-based solutions (NbS) must use place-appropriate and evidence-backed living processes and infrastructure, such as soil and vegetation, to lead to improved long-term ecosystem function and community health and wellbeing. Success of nature-based solutions should be evaluated using the following criteria and indicators:

Criteria	Criterion 1: NbS are appropriate to the local social and ecological context.	Criterion 2: NbS are designed and regularly monitored and evaluated based on scientific, indigenous, traditional, and local knowledge.	Criterion 3: NbS are economically viable.
Indicators	<ul> <li>NbS planning process includes a comprehensive constituent map analysis to identify those who may be directly and indirectly impacted by the NbS.</li> <li>Undertake a baseline assessment to characterize current social and ecological conditions, and then outline options for improvements using living processes and infrastructure.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>NbS design includes a clear and measurable monitoring and evaluation plan.</li> <li>NbS design and implementation consults landscaping specialists with ties to the local and/or indigenous community and who use local and native plants.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>NbS are self-sustaining, requiring minimal operations and maintenance in the long term (10+ years).</li> <li>Undertake a cost-benefit analysis of the NbS, including direct and indirect costs, benefits, and associated societal externalities.</li> </ul>
